Oxfordshire Historic Trust, Annual Ride and Stride

14th September 2024, 10am-6pm

September is the time to Ride and Stride. This is a sponsored bike ride or walk in which members of All Saints' join people from all over the county to cycle or walk around the city, or nearby towns and villages. The idea is to visit as many churches as possible in the day between 10am and 6pm, and be sponsored for each one. There are more than 550 eligible churches and chapels in Oxfordshire to choose from. The event is organised by the Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust and your sponsorship money will be shared between the Trust and All Saints'. Since 1964 The Trust has raised over £3.5 million.

We do hope you will join in this year's Ride and Stride event. If you would like to cycle or walk we will have a list to sign at the back of the church and you will be able to pick up a sponsor form. If you have not done this before and would like to give it a try have a word with James Larminie or myself, we have done it many times.

Age UK Oxfordshire's Homeshare Service

Age UK Oxfordshire's Homeshare service carefully brings together an older person (or couple) who would benefit from companionship or practical support at home, with another person (usually a professional, a keyworker or a mature student) who is happy to lend a helping hand and who is seeking affordable accommodation.

In this safe and mutually beneficial living arrangement, the Householder provides a spare room in a welcoming home and, in return, can expect around 10 hours of help each week as a combination of companionship and practical support. The reassuring presence of another person in the house overnight also brings peace of mind.

Each Homeshare match is individual and carefully agreed and may include any of the following - cooking, shopping, gardening, help with technology and mobile phones, along with time spent together over a cup of tea or a maybe an evening meal. The occasional lift, trip or excursion might also form part of the agreement. A Homeshare arrangement does not involve any personal care but can sometimes sit quite comfortably alongside care provision from elsewhere.

Monthly fees are payable to Age UK Oxfordshire by both Householder and Sharer and cover the costs of the safety checks, the setting up and facilitation of the match, and the provision of regular, ongoing in-person support. <u>Homeshare Oxfordshire</u> is the local Homeshare provider for Oxfordshire, offering a personal, face to face service and providing ongoing contact and support for the duration of the Homeshare arrangement.


